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Neighbourhood Plan Update

The Steering Group has now reached the stage of preparing the Draft commissioning a full ecological survey and a housing needs survey to be included in the Neighbourhood Plan. The draft is expected to be presented for approval to the Parish Council meeting on 19 October 2015, and will then be available for six weeks for public scrutiny under what is known as 'Regulation 14 Consultation'. This means that you as residents will have an opportunity to comment on anything in the draft Plan.

A formal Notice of Consultation will be published on the website and on the two notice-boards (Co-op Store, Cronkinson Shopping Parade and outside Stapeley Broad Lane Academy). This will explain how to comment and the deadline by which your comments are required.

The Plan will be made available on-line on the Parish Council's website and it is intended that paper copies will be provided at Nantwich Public Library, the Community Hall (Tuesdays only between 11.00 am and 1.00 pm) and possibly the Co-operative store, Stapeley.

Muller Group Homes	Automated External Defibrillator (AED)
<p>Residents will be aware that Muller Group Homes had lodged an appeal with the High Court, to be heard on 14 July 2015.</p> <p>At this stage, although nothing formal has been received, the local press has reported that the Secretary of State has decided not to fight the appeal.</p> <p>We will keep you informed as events unfold and as soon as we are aware of the official position and the implications for the parish, we will issue a press release and add a post to the website.</p>	<p>The AED has now been delivered and arrangements are in hand for it to be fixed to the wall of the Co-op store.</p> <p>The location of the equipment is crucial and the Parish Council is grateful to the Co-operative Store for agreeing to it being fixed to its outside wall where it will be accessible 24 hours a day.</p> <p>AEDs check the heart rhythm and can send an electric shock to the heart to try to restore a normal rhythm. They are used to treat sudden cardiac arrest which is a condition where the heart suddenly and unexpectedly stops beating. When this happens, blood stops flowing to the brain and other vital organs. Each minute lost in treatment leads to a 10% reduction in survival.</p> <p>The system is fully automated, but it is hoped that NW Ambulance Trust staff will be able to carry out an awareness session in the community hall later in the year.</p> <p>We hope that there will never be a need to use the equipment, but it is reassuring to know that it is there if needed. We hope that this initiative will be welcomed by the community.</p>
